ANNUAL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Arden Falk, Fort Ransom; Sid Meidinger, Fredonia; and Dan Girard, Ellendale were re-elected to the Dickey Rural Telephone Cooperative (DRTC) Board of Directors at its 74th Annual Meeting held on Oct. 17, 2024 at the Ellendale Public School.

DRN Board President Ralph Neu and Kent Schimke, DRN CEO/general manager updated approximately 235 registered members and guests who attended the meeting on the financial health of the cooperative. In honor of the cooperative difference and their guiding principles, this year's annual meeting theme was 'Providing a Better Connection" highlighting the continual work to make upgrades to improve the reliability of service provided to our members.

At the meeting, Schimke and Neu shared net margins for 2023 were over \$9 million. Schimke reported the cooperative returned over \$9.9 million in capital credits to members in 2023. "We have

How Does 5G Home Internet Differ from Fiber Internet?

You may be hearing a lot these days about the 5G home Internet offered by cellular providers. But what exactly is it, and how does it differ from fiber Internet?

Before we compare these two Internet technologies, let's clear up a common misconception. The abbreviation 5G refers to the fifth generation of wireless technology for cellular networks, which was initially released in 2019. The "G" in 5G does NOT stand for gigabit and has nothing to do with Internet speeds.

FIBER INTERNET

How It Works

Fiber Internet uses fiber-optic cables consisting of bundled strands of glass, which are buried under the ground to provide a direct Internet connection. Fiber is the gold standard.

Speeds

A range of fiber Internet plans are typically offered, with speeds up to 10 Glgs (10,000 Mbps) and more. You may also be able to get symmetrical speeds, meaning your uploads are just as fast as your downloads.

Reliability

Fiber Internet has a much larger capacity to carry data and is less prone to technical malfunctions or slowdowns. This results in a connection you can count on, with a proven track record of 99.9% reliability.

5G HOME INTERNET

How It Works

5G home Internet uses the 5G network towers of a cellular company to provide a fixed wireless connection. Speeds will vary by location, depending on how far the customer is from a local tower or transmitter.

Speeds

Speeds offered by 5G home Internet average just 150 Mbps. What's more, several factors can adversely affect speeds, including network congestion and line-of-sight issues from obstacles such as buildings or terrain. Even inclement weather can slow things down.

Reliability

5G home Internet can get bogged down by high-traffic demands and technical issues stemming from poor cell service.

It's clear that despite the hype around 5G, fiber remains the go-to connection type for extremely fast and reliable Internet. Simply put, you can't do better than fiber Internet. It's the preferred connection — and the best overall value — for indivduals, couples, large households with multiple users and devices, people who work from home, online gamers, and streaming enthusiasts.

North Dakota 911 technology connects caller in South Dakota to emergency services in right state

Next Generation 911 could be implemented to more parts of the North Dakota-South Dakota border.

Telephone technology in North Dakota is helping emergency dispatchers reroute 911 calls near the South Dakota border to the correct state, according to a group that oversees the program.

Next Generation 911 recently rerouted a call made to the DRN, formerly known as the Dickey Rural Telephone Co., to South Dakota emergency services, according to a release from the North Dakota Association of Counties. DRN is located in Ellendale, North Dakota, about 5 miles north of the South Dakota border, but the person who called was in South Dakota, according to the release.

The association, which oversees Next Generation 911, or NG911, called the achievement a "milestone." The call routing technology will allow emergency crews to respond more quickly to calls for service, the release said.

"We have struggled considerably with finding cost-effective ways to handle out-of-state originating service providers (OSPs) which have a very small number of wireline subscribers in our state," said Jason Horning, NG911 program manager in North Dakota. "This deployment demonstrated that it may not be necessary to directly connect out-of-state OSPs to our emergency services network, allowing them to leverage their existing connectivity to the state in which they primarily do business."

North Dakota has been transitioning to NG911 for a decade, Horning told The Forum. The state enabled the feature to help reroute emergency calls to the correct state in October, he said.

Using geospatial call routing, NG911 can pinpoint a caller's latitude and longitude location using the person's cellphone, Horning said.

So far, the technology has only worked with the DRN, Horning said. He said the state has a "little way to go" as it works to further implement NG911 along the North Dakota-South Dakota border.

North Dakota is looking into the deployment of NG911 and documenting "the requirements necessary to make it a repeatable configuration," the release said.

"There are details we are still working through, but clearly this is possible and may serve as a model for other out-of-state OSPs that we engage in an effort to make sure every North Dakota and South Dakota resident receives the proper PSAP (public safety answering point) on initial delivery," Horning said in a statement.

DRN is proud to be one of the first in the state to successfully implement next-generation technology for routing 911 calls. This groundbreaking achievement reflects our commitment to innovation and excellence for our members.

\$3 Million in Capital Credits Paid

We are pleased to announce the distribution of \$3,000,000 in capital credits to our members was paid out in December 2024. 10,295 members benefited from this distribution, with an average check amounting to over \$285.

Out of the total recipients, 5,946 members received a check, while 4,349 members saw the credit applied directly to their December 2024 bill. This initiative underscores DRN ReadiTech's commitment to returning value to its members and supporting the community.

As a member of the DRN cooperative, you are the recipient of patronage capital credits on your DRN account. Capital credits are the amount allocated to each member from the cooperative's profits from telephone and Internet. ANNUAL NOTIFICATIONS

Do Not Call Residential Notification

To address consumer concerns about unwelcome telemarketing calls, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and Federal Trade Commission (FTC) established a national Do-Not-Call Registry. The registry applies to all telemarketers (with the exception of certain non-profit and political organizations) and covers both interstate and intrastate telemarketing calls. Commercial telemarketers are not allowed to call you if your number is listed on the registry.

Consumers may register their residential phone number, and wireless numbers, on the national Do-Not-Call Registry for free. To register by phone, call 1-888-382-1222. For TTY call 1-866-290-4236. You must call from the phone number you wish to register. Or, register online at donotcall.gov. Telemarketers have up to 31 days to get your phone number and remove it from their call lists.



Battery Backup Notification

DRN reminds customers your telecommunications services are powered by electricity. If your main power source goes out, all fiber customers have a backup power supply box provided by DRN in your home, apartment complex, or office building.

The battery backup powers telephone service for approximately eight hours. This means the backup will provide eight hours of in use time or talk time. If the power is out for an extended period of time, telephone service will continue to work as long as the battery backup has not been depleted of its eight hours of in use time. During a power outage, Internet and television service disconnects immediately.

In order to keep you and your family connected during an extended power outage, DRN recommends connecting your home or business to a backup generator or emergency backup battery. DRN offers a 24-hour extended battery for purchase. For details on buying an extended battery or any other questions regarding the battery backup, contact a customer care specialist at (701) 344-5000.

Federal Lifeline Assistance

For those who can't afford communication services–Lifeline, a federal program, can help eligible people pay part of their phone or broadband bill.

Lifeline can save you up to \$9.25 on your monthly phone bill for basic local telephone service or broadband. Lifeline assistance applies only to service in the home where you live.

Who is eligible?* An individual is eligible if he or she participates in one of the following programs:

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Medicaid
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Federal Public Housing Assistance
- Veterans Pension or Survivors Pension

In addition, a consumer may be eligible if his or her household income is at or below 135% of the federal poverty guidelines.

* Only eligible persons may apply. Only one discount is available per household. Lifeline is non-transferable.

How to obtain assistance: Offices that administer a program under which you are eligible for Lifeline may automatically send you an Assistance Certificate in the mail. Anyone wishing to participate in Lifeline is required to sign a form indicating, under oath, that they qualify to participate because they meet at least one of the program eligibility requirements. This must be signed and returned with a copy of your income or program eligibility.

What if my benefits stop? If you no longer qualify for any economic program, you no longer qualify for Lifeline.
